“The mission of the Institute of Political Science of the SAS is basic research into political relations and processes within their internal and international political contexts. The Institute focuses on conducting studies in the area of international relations and political systems, the history of political thought, the research methods of political sciences and recent political history.”

The Foundation Charter of the Institute of Political Science, Slovak Academy of Sciences, was adopted in 2002. Pursuant to § 21a para. 1 of the Academy Act and the founding charter of a public research institution issued by the Slovak Academy of Sciences under § 21a para. 2 letter (a) of the Academy Act, the Institute of Political Sciences of the Slovak Academy of Sciences changed its legal status to that of a public research institution on 1/7/2018. As at 10/9/2018, the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sports of the Slovak Republic issued Resolution No. 2018/11372:4-01CC, which suspended the registration procedure in the Register of Public Research Institutions for the organizations of the Slovak Academy of Sciences. As at 26/9/2018, Act No. 270/2018 Coll., which also amended and supplemented the law on the academy, came into force; as of 26/9/2018, under § 21b pars. 1 and 2 of the Academy Act as amended by Act No. 270/2018 Coll., the organizations of the Slovak Academy of Sciences have reverted to the status of a budgetary or contributory organization.

As at 5/10/2021, Act No. 347/2021 Coll., which amended and supplemented the Academy Act and the Geological Act, came into force; as at 1/1/2022, under § 21aa para. 1 of the Academy Act as amended by Act No. 347/2021 Coll., organizations of the Slovak Academy of Sciences changed their legal status to public research institutions. Pursuant to § 21aa para. 1 of the Academy Act and in compliance with this founding charter, the Institute of Political Sciences of the Slovak Academy of Sciences changes its legal status from a state budget organization to a public research institution.

The new Founding Charter of the Institute of Political Science of the Slovak Academy of Sciences, public research institution, was approved by the Presidency of the Slovak Academy of Sciences at its meeting on 28 October 2021 and entered into force on 1 January 2022.

“(1) The organisation’s main activity is research into the following disciplines of science and technology (hereinafter also "disciplines"): Political Science (050600), General History (060109), Slovak History (060108), Other Related Disciplines of Philosophy (060305), Sociology (050401), International Economic Relations (050209), International Relations (050224), Theory and History of State and Law (050501), Political Geography (010518).

(2) Other major activities of the organization include:

(a) securing and managing the research and development infrastructure owned by the organization; the extent of research and development infrastructure, whose possession shall be granted to the organization by virtue of changing its legal status to a public research institution as at 1/1/2022, shall follow from the protocol between the Slovak Academy of Sciences and the organization pursuant to § 21aa para. 11 of the Academy Act,

(b) acquisition, processing and dissemination of scientific and technological information and of findings gained from its own research and development, namely, in the disciplines referred to in paragraph 1; publication of the journal *Studia Politica Slovaca* (ISSN 1337-8163 printed, ISSN 2858-8459 online), of edition series *Monografie a štúdie* (Monographs and studies), *Dokumenty* (Documents), *Pamäť* (Memory), *Reflexie* (Reflections), *Svedectvá* (Testimonies),

(c) joint collaboration with universities and institutes on the implementation of doctoral degree programs, namely, those of Political Science and related disciplines.

Since 2016, one can speak of the elements of continuity and discontinuity in the research conducted at the Institute of Political Science of the Slovak Academy of Sciences, a fact that partly follows from the recommendations of the Evaluation Panel for 2012-2015. Compared to the original four areas, the institute has decided to reduce its research to three domains - political theory, comparative politics and international relations. On the other hand, these areas are not regarded in isolation but, on the contrary, tend to overlap in a number of research projects undertaken by the Institute. Several employees who mostly specialise in historical research left the IPS. The newly recruited researchers, mostly of the young and middle generation, are more focused on research into political science.

The main factor that has influenced the nature of research and the selection of topics addressed at the Institute was the effort to foster the institute's internationalization, which was significantly helped by the acquisition of the SASPRO project (2016 - 2018). Following its completion, the project's research team member Dirk Dalberg joined the Institute staff. The personnel structure of the institute has also changed in other ways - not only in terms of improving the ratio between scholarly and administrative staff, but also as a result of the recruitment of young fellow researchers. One of the newly hired employees is involved in the research project within Horizon 2020 (EU3D Differentiation, Dominance and Democracy (EU3D Differentiation, Dominance and Democracy, 2019 - 2023). Another staff member has participated in the "Network of Experts" project under Horizon 2020, No. 692919, "COURAGE: Cultural opposition - Understanding cultural heritage of dissent in the former socialist countries" (2016 - 2019). During the period covered by the report, we sought to increase the relevance of our publications by publishing in domestic and foreign journals indexed in the WOS and SCOPUS databases, and also with prestigious international publishers. Cooperation with other political science institutes in Slovakia has also expanded through the involvement of the IPS SAS in a number of APVV projects. In recent years, the issue of merging with institutes within the SAS that are larger in size in terms of the number of staff has been discussed; although dismissed in the past, the proposal is currently the subject of negotiations.

Political theory

In the field of research into political theory, we follow up on the previous research into the political thought of the representatives of the Czechoslovak dissent. In this area, research has abandoned the traditional paradigm of daily dissident life and the role of political persecutions in the consolidation of the so-called "Normalization" regime in Czechoslovakia (1969 - 1989) to shift the focus towards the analysis of the history of ideas. This topic has been researched mainly by two of our colleagues - Dr Dirk Dalberg and Dr Norbert Kmeť, who have used the challenge-and-response approach. Such an approach helps to bridge the research gaps in the knowledge of Marxist and former Marxist Czechoslovak dissidents and their political thinking in the 1970s and 1980s. So far, the wider expert audience has not been familiar with their work, which has escaped a more thorough theoretical examination and reflection even in Slovakia. The research, largely conducted within the SASPRO project, succeeded in removing the Central European-regional language barrier, placing them into the context of international research, where they gained due recognition and voice, which, until then, had only been heard by Slovak and Czech experts. The research focused on such prominent figures of Slovak and Czech political thought as Miroslav Kusý, Petr Uhl, Egon Bondy or Milan Šimečka as custodians of the intellectual heritage of what is commonly referred to as the Prague Spring. Most notable representatives of dissent from other Central and Eastern European countries (such as Adam Michnik) and the political thought of the Russian émigrés living in the Czechoslovak Republic in the interwar period have also been examined. The new generation of fellow researchers deals with current issues of the theory of democracy and problems of democracy.

In the above area of political theory, we also continue to analyse the Marxist reflection of the post-communist transition, a fact that was viewed favourably by the Evaluation Panel for the 2012-2015 period. We have focused on the analysis of globalization and alternatives to its neoliberal model. In this domain, we can highlight Dr Ľuboš Blaha's monograph *Antiglobalist*, which provides an analysis of the globalization processes in three dimensions - political, cultural and economic through the prism of social liberalism, communitarianism, neo-Marxism and anarchism, and offers a discussion of progressive alternatives while defending the concept of deglobalization. The monograph has also been published in English by Peter Lang (2021) and is indexed in the SCOPUS database. Furthermore, there were other publications focusing on the analysis of Marxist thought in the Slovak and international contexts, thereby filling the gap caused by insufficient interest in normative political theories in the Central and East European region.

Within the confines of research into political theory, we have centred our attention on the evolution of political science in the Slovak and Czech contexts as part of intellectual history. As an example, we have published a study that maps efforts to restore the discipline in the 1960s Czechoslovakia and M. Kusý's role in this process. The editors of the *Studia Politica Slovaca Journal* have prepared a special thematic issue dedicated to this prominent representative of Slovak political science (the first head of the Department of Political Science at Comenius University after 1989, following the establishment of the discipline in Slovakia), with Norbert Kmeť as guest editor, authored by key figures in Slovak political science. The research also focused on other notable figures in the history

of social sciences in Slovakia, namely, Anton Štefánek, the founder of sociology in Slovakia, and Andrej Sirácky, who took part in the restoration of the discipline in the 1960s. Both were also active politicians.

IPS SAS has also participated in the research into the political concepts of Czechoslovakism as a state and ethno-political doctrine of the first Czechoslovak Republic, namely, into various aspects of its reflection following the collapse of the communist regime in 1989, either as a political ideology or as a political practice. A fellow researcher of the IPS SAS has co-authored a collective monograph on the same subject, which, although published in the Czech Republic, has gained recognition outside the narrow Slovak-Czech context; the relevance of this subject is evidenced by the fact that Routledge (2022) has shown interest to publish it in English³. The particular subject of research was the role of Czechoslovakism in structuring the Slovak political arena as one of the most salient cleavages.

A new line of research in the field of political theory is the examination of fascism, which, however, closely overlaps with another dimension of research - comparative politics. The upcoming defence of the doctoral dissertation at the Institute, focussing on the presence of fascist elements in the politics of People's Party Our Slovakia, while being a frequent target of reflection by the media and judicial authorities, has not yet been tackled in the Slovak or foreign scholarly setting; this endeavour thus attempts to close the gap in the area. The Institute has also dealt with the issue of anti-fascism as a discursive category against the background of nationalist and ideological narratives in the European context.

Comparative politics

Research in the field of comparative politics has experienced some evolution. In addition to traditional subjects such as the party system and the development of political institutions, the Institute also continued to implement projects focused on issues of collective memory and its role in structuring political competition and creating divisions or cleavages in society. However, recent projects in this area have focused on discursive aspects and, alongside party actors, also on non-party actors in political processes such as civil society, the media, non-governmental organizations, academic or research institutions. This is caused by the growing ideological and program diversity of political actors, which in turn results in identity aspects coming to the fore. This means that the research cannot draw only on official documents of political actors but also on the analysis of media and intellectual debate. Based on the development of political discourse, the research has been centred on the structuring but also on the erosion and merging of individual political cleavages, which, not only in the early 1990's, were reduced to a two-block rivalry and perception of political competition from the perspective of political actors through the binary opposition of "us vs. them". In this spirit, two VEGA projects were conceived (Marušiak, Kmeť), their follow-up being participation in the APVV project aimed at the fragmentation of public discourse in the wake of the onset of the so-called conspiracy theories.

The research has centred on the issues of shaping the political system in the Slovak Republic and the functioning of its individual institutions. Based on the source material provided by the National Council, M. Pekník's work has brought new findings concerning the formation of the political system in the Slovak Republic in the first years following the political change. Other publications analysing the above period pertain to the impact of socio-cultural factors and historical aspects on the shape of post-1989 democratic politics in Slovakia, namely, on the relationship between the national emancipation process and democracy from the turn of the 1990s, the flaws of democratic traditions, the social aspects of democratic change and its political implications such as new forms of exclusion, but also on the role of negotiating elements in the process of regime change in the Slovak Republic in 1989. Many of these issues have not yet been addressed by the political science research in Slovakia. Oľga Plávková's publication, which has brought a secondary analysis of the results of public opinion polls conducted by the IPS SAS in 2003 and 2008, was also part of the efforts to discuss the issue of post-1989 development, while a number of such findings have not yet been published. IPS SAS has further focused on other aspects such as the functioning of individual elements of the political system in the Slovak Republic (functioning of the welfare state, the relationship between the state and the churches in the period before and after 1989, the influence of elections to self-governing regions as second-order elections on the form of party competition, etc.).

A number of publications in the domain of comparative politics were aimed at the evolution of political parties in the Slovak Republic, particularly at individual aspects of their activities. In the field of programmatics, we have focused on such aspects as attitudes to European integration, especially in terms of comparing the period before and after EU accession and identifying the role of European integration as a political cleavage in the political competition in Slovakia. Subsequently, we have centred on the new trends in the party policy of the Slovak Republic – on the de-Europeanization of the party agenda as well as on ideology and the changes in the organizational nature of the parties, which are being replaced by "political entrepreneurship". A fellow worker from the Institute had joined an international team of authors to put together a book on radical left-wing political parties in Europe, published by the London-based Merlin Press Publishing House.

Transformations of the political system in the Slovak Republic were also examined from the historical and international comparative perspectives. In this regard, one should mention, inter alia, the analysis of the beginnings of the process of destalinization in the Slovak Republic within the context of "detotalitarianisation" and changes in the policy of creating political elites by the communist regime on the example of the regime's policy towards youth and students in the latter half of the 1950s in the Central European context. The monograph "Príliš skoré predjarie..." by J. Marušiak publication has won the SAS Award for the Results of Scientific and Research Work (2021) and the Egon Erwin Kisch International Award, awarded by the Czech Club of Non-Fiction Authors and the Slovak Club of Non-Fiction Authors. Research into the historical aspects of the shaping of Slovak politics also touched on its individual actors, such as the formation of political exile. Jointly with the Institute of Sociology, the IPS SAS also participated in the preparation of the publication *The all-too-human face of socialism*, which centred on the issue of civic collective actors in the reform process (media, churches, national minorities, intellectuals or art unions) in 1968 with a primary focus on their interpretation of the nature and objectives of democratization processes.

One of the new research topics at the IPS SAS as a result of the employment of young researchers is the question of the future of democracy as a political regime. Their research has been focused on the reconstruction of the current discourses on the "crisis of democracy" and the media actors' interactions in public debate, their impact on the creation of echo chambers and the quality of democratic debate. In cooperation with the Central European Political Science Association (CEPSA), a fellow researcher from the institute participated in the work on an international publication on the consequences of the Covid-19 pandemic for the state of political science in the Central European region, particularly, for teaching the subject at universities. The preparation of the publication is part of an effort to form a consortium in order to apply for a more broadly conceived international project on the given subject.

International relations

The subject of international relations and Slovakia's foreign policy has remained a relevant part of shaping the Institute's professional focus. In addition to the institutional aspects, we have dealt with in the past, other issues have come to the fore such as energy security (APVV Energy Union) and post-Covid 19 Green Recovery, where the institute's staff have mainly aimed to tackle the foreign policy aspects of these issues at EU level as well as at the level of relations between the Central European countries and the Russian Federation. Other projects have been centred on foreign policy-making processes in the Slovak Republic, but also on the issue of Slovakia's bilateral relations with its major foreign partners. What has also been examined is the status of national minorities in Central Europe. Hence, work in this area is very closely linked to the previous two domains.

Research on the institutional dimension of foreign and security policy is currently being carried out mainly in the context of European integration. It draws on the organization theory, the study of institutions / institutional theory, differentiated integration, the EU's foreign and security policy and the processes undermining EU's governance. It deals with the EU's role in the society of states and with the impact that a non-state actor has on the transformation of the institutions of diplomacy and sovereignty, which are foundational institutions of the international system of states, as well as civil-military relations in Slovakia. The above issues are addressed in papers published by the peer-reviewed journal *The Hague Journal of Diplomacy* and by the Oxford University Press. The institutional aspects of European integration are the subject of the EU3D Differentiation, Dominance and Democracy (Horizon 2020) projects and the APVV Differentiated Integration grant, which we received in 2022. Other work has concerned the institutional aspects of Slovakia's foreign policy, e.g. at parliamentary level.

Other projects of the institute pertained to the discursive aspects of Slovakia's foreign policy, namely, the process of formation of the image of "Other", i.e., of a foreign partner, of discursively constructed power relations and the share of domestic political actors in shaping Slovakia's foreign policy priorities. We drew on the theories of social constructivism, but also on Pierre Bourdieu's theories of the capital. From this perspective, we have also analysed energy policy issues, which are closely linked to Slovakia's relations with the countries of Eastern Europe, especially with the Russian Federation and Ukraine. One of the most relevant publications in this area is the collective monograph *Seeking the National Interest: Slovakia after 15 Years of EU and NATO Accession* (Stuttgart: ibidem Verlag 2019), with major/valuable/substantial contribution from authors – members of the IPS SAS (Marušiak, Kmeť, Dalberg). Other publications explored the formation of bilateral relations with countries such Poland or Russian Federation. The cooperation between IPS SAS and the Office of the Government of the Slovak Republic yielded a monograph on the still-sensitive issue of the population exchange between Czechoslovakia and Hungary in 1946-1948, where the Institute's members provided expert reviews⁴. Research into the issue of national minorities in Central Europe in a comparative perspective led to the publication of a collective monograph authored by researchers from Slovakia, United Kingdom, Hungary, Ukraine and Belarus, who addressed the dilemma between human rights and securitization approaches that nation states apply to their minorities. The main value of the publication lies in the comparison between the two approaches. Foreign policy concepts have also been examined in an international perspective.

Current issues worth exploring include terrorism and international migration; these topics have been addressed not only because of the 2015 refugee crisis; in addition to theoretical reflection on political and moral aspects of migration, the research has also focused on the transformation of Slovakia from a country that was predominantly a producer of migrants to a destination country of international migration following Slovakia's entry into the European Union. The institute's publications follow the issue of migration both in the context of its consequences for the formation of Slovakia's political culture and also with regard to the formation of new transnational ties as a result of primarily labour and economic

The research has been conducted through semi-structured interviews with migrants, using the theoretical approaches of I. Wallerstein's centre-periphery relations. 2.1.8. Narrative on the most important research outputs of the institute – especially focused on their importance for society (3-5 pages)

In the period 2016-2021, research at the Institute of Political Science focused on three areas - political theory, comparative politics and international relations, with several projects seeking to study these areas not in isolation, but in relation to each other. In the field of **political theory**, the most important publications are the works of Dirk Dalberg⁵. They focused on the programmes of social self-management in the environment of the Czech and Slovak dissident movement, specifically in the works of Petr Uhl, Miroslav Kusý and other protagonists of the democratic opposition against the communist regime in the 1970s and 1980s. The research has made it possible to place these concepts in a broader European context, as similar debates were also taking place in Western liberal democracies during this period. At the same time, they filled a void in the research on political thought in Central and Eastern Europe, as the works of the above-mentioned representatives of dissent fit into the tradition that revolves around finding a correct interpretation of Marx. The principles of self-managed socialism were also partly reflected during the so-called perestroika in the second half of the 1980s by the Czechoslovak communist authorities, e.g. in the field of economic management. D. Dalberg's research sparked the interest of the broader political science community, and at the request of the Department of Political Science at the Faculty of Arts, Comenius University, D. Dalberg conducted a course for undergraduate students in 2017 and 2018 focusing on political thought in the Czechoslovak dissident movement.

The works by D. Dalberg, as well as other publications of the Institute's staff⁶ on the issue of social change at the turn of the 1980s and 1990s, aroused the interest of the wider professional public, especially in the context of the 30th anniversary of the political changes in Czechoslovakia. The Institute's staff working on the issue have often been invited to speak to the media in this context.

Norbert Kmet' and Juraj Marušiak also cooperate closely with the Institute of Memory of Nation, which is engaged in documentation, scientific interpretation, as well as dissemination of knowledge to the wider public on a professional level, as reviewers of scientific and popular-educational publications published by the Institute, as well as on the editorial board of the journal *Pamäť národa* [Memory of Nation], which is published by this Institute.

A new topic of research is the evolution of democracy and the emergence of the phenomenon of post-democracy. The research by Michael Augustin analyzes the treatment of the concept of post-democracy in the works of Jacques Rancière, Jürgen Habermas, Colin Crouch and others, and on this ground, it is problematizing temporal and spatial reductionism present in some conceptualisations of post-democracy, pointing to the contingency, temporality and contextuality of the forms of representative democracy as a possible way out of the melancholy nostalgia for a "golden age" of democracy and a way to seek a *modus vivendi* of democracy and representation in new condition⁷.

In the field of **comparative politics**, the research is mainly aimed to the issue of political parties, but also to the construction of the political system of the Slovak Republic, partly also in an international comparative perspective, or the functioning of specific political institutions. Among the most important publications of a monographic nature published at the Institute of Political Science of the Slovak Academy of Sciences are works on the first years of the post-communist transformation, which aimed to provide a synthetic view of the development of Slovakia in the first half of the 1990s on the basis of archival research⁸, or on the basis of an analysis of the ideological and systemic transformation of the communist regime in Czechoslovakia in the second half of the 1950s⁹. The second book presents an analysis of the policy of the Communist Party of Czechoslovakia towards the youth in the second half of the 1950s in terms of self-sovietization, understood as the implementation of the cultural patterns, institutions, political and social practices of the USSR by the Czechoslovak communist elites and, on the other hand, through the prism of the tendency to transmit the utopian visions of the so-called new socialist man to future generations. The book attempts to identify why in the past, especially in the 1990s, not only the student events of 1956, but the whole period of destalinization remained outside the deeper interest of researchers in the Slovak and Czech milieu. The author analyses the period of destalinization not only from the point of view of democratization efforts and the gradual weakening of the repressive character of the communist regime despite the short-lived increase in repression in 1957-1958, but also from the point of view of N. S. Khrushchev's efforts to formulate a new ideological vision of the Soviet model of socialism. The book has attracted media interest, especially in the context of the debate on the different models of political behaviour of the Slovak population during the communist regime, with the result of the research challenging the simplistic picture of the development of society in the period under study, reduced to the conflict between the regime and the rest of society, or between communists and non-communists. At the same time, however, such an interpretation does not call into question the non-democratic and repressive character of the regime in Czechoslovakia between 1948 and 1989.

Other works on the political system in Slovakia refer to new tendencies, such as the emergence of so-called business-firm parties, while this model is also becoming attractive for program-based parties. The main indicators followed by the article are the role of the party founders (leaders) after the parties enter the parliament, the organizational development of the parties and the role of party programs in the shaping of party identities. The paper brings an analysis of the penetration of business practices in Slovakia's political parties. The penetration of entrepreneurial practices into the functioning of other political parties, provoked new political conflicts in Slovakia. These are interpreted by some politicians as a conflict between so called "standard" and "non-standard" parties. Successful parliamentary elections, and even participation in the government, doesn't force the parties to establish territorial structures or to improve internal democratic mechanisms¹⁰. Another trend analysed in the research of political parties in Slovakia was the process of their de-

Europeanisation, i.e. moving away or even retreating from the positions of partner parties in the EU¹¹. The research on political parties and the formation of the political system in the Slovak Republic resulted in invitations of the Institute's staff to the media (Juraj Marušiak, Norbert Kmet', Michael Augustín) and in invited requested lectures, including lectures at major foreign universities (e.g. University of Warsaw, Poland) and events for the broader public (e.g. Slovak Institute in Warsaw, 2018 etc.), as well as lectures organized for the broader public. The Institute's staff member has also contributed to the publication of the collective monograph "Slovakia. A European Story", published in the context of Slovakia's presidency of the European Council in 2016, where he authored a chapter on internal political developments in Slovakia after 1993¹². Another example of social impact of our Institute is the participation of the institute member in the activities of the *Progressive Forum* NGO cooperating with the Slovak branch of Friedrich Ebert Foundation. This organization is conducting discussions on the current problems of political development in Slovakia from a social democratic perspective¹³.

In the field of **international relations**, one of the most important publications is the article by Matej Navrátil¹⁴. His article argues that by using the European Union Delegation (EUD) in Sarajevo as an organisational proxy, the EU creates tools allowing it to participate in the enhancement of external administrative co-governance in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Inspired by the organisation theory approach, this article conceives of the EUD Sarajevo as a *hybrid organisation*. Such organisations are defined as a product of a combination of two sovereign organisations pursuing a common interest. They recombine multiple institutional logics, stimulate institutional change and spark innovative practices. The conceptualisation of the EUD Sarajevo as a hybrid organisation offers analytical insight for understanding the EU's role in the society of states and allows us to theorise more concretely about the impact that a non-state actor has on the transformation of the institutions of diplomacy and sovereignty, which are foundational institutions of the international system of states.

Research has also focused on the issue of Visegrad cooperation and the Central European region in general, where we can highlight in particular the works of Vladimír Goněc¹⁵, which deal with the future of Visegrad cooperation both in terms of its historical and cultural determinants, and in terms of its future in the context of such challenges as, for example, the development of the Visegrad region. Other authors are focused on bilateral relations in Central and Eastern Europe¹⁶, taking into account the Europeanization processes and related concepts of the so-called new bilateralism. A joint project of IPS SAS and the Department of Political Science and Eurasian Studies resulted in a collective monograph devoted to the issue of the formation of the "national interest" of Slovakia,

based on the approaches of social constructivism¹⁷. The “national interest” as a foreign policy priority is perceived not as a static, objectively existing category, but as an analytical category whose key indicators are consensus support and relevance in society. Thus, the publication focuses both on domestic political actors (state institutions, political parties, NGOs) and on specific foreign policy priorities in terms of their perception by domestic political actors.

Long-term research in the field of international relations is also reflected in the Institute's cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Slovak Republic. In the context of the Slovak Presidency of the Council of the EU in 2016, the Institute of Foreign Affairs of the Slovak Academy of Sciences acted as an expert guarantor in the organisation of events dedicated to the 95th anniversary of the birth of Alexander Dubček (Uhrovec, November 2016, seminar for youth - Alexander Dubček - a politician with a human face, scientific research seminar “Alexander Dubček - a significant personality in the modern history of Slovakia and European politics”. IPS SAS also collaborated on the presentation of the bust of Alexander Dubček at the Bratislava Castle, which was unveiled at the European Parliament in Strasbourg in December 2016. In 2016, IPS SAS, in cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Slovak Republic, participated as an expert gestor in the publication of the essays and studies of one of the founders of Slovak diplomacy in the first half of the 1990s, Svetoslav Bombík, and a year later in the organization of a seminar dedicated to this prematurely deceased personality of Slovak diplomacy¹⁸. In cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs, Institute participated in the publishing of the second edition of the publication by another founder of the Slovak diplomacy – Miroslav Mojžita¹⁹.

As part of the preparation and implementation of the presidency, other events dedicated to leading figures of Slovak politics in the 20th century were held at the University Library in Bratislava, with a special focus on those personalities who were involved in the fight against fascism and Nazism (A. Dubček, M.R. Štefánik, V. Šrobár, F. Juriga, M. Rázus, J. G. Tajovský, A. Štefánek). Institute member J. Marušiak was also actively involved in the preparation of documents for the preparation of the Medium-term Strategy of Foreign Policy of the Slovak Republic in cooperation with the Research Centre of the Slovak Society for Foreign Policy, which was the coordinator of this task commissioned by the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Slovak Republic (2021). Since 2021 he has also been involved in the preparation of the Slovak V4 and S3 Presidency in 2022.

In terms of social impact, however, among the most significant activities of the Institute are those that build on earlier research on leading figures personalities of 20th century Slovak politics, focusing on those actors who significantly contributed to the formation of the democratic regime of the first Czechoslovak Republic and the struggle against authoritarian tendencies that began to dominate the Central European space from the 1930s onwards. Since the 1990s, IPS SAS has been a co-organiser of the Milan Hodža Days organised in Bratislava, Martin and Sučany. Milan Hodža was the first Slovak politician to hold the position of Prime Minister of the Czechoslovak Republic (1935-1938), speaking out against the threat of Nazism and Soviet communism. During the Days of Milan Hodža, the Institute is the professional guarantor of scientific conferences, annually dedicated to individual prominent representatives of the First Czechoslovak Republic, as well as the competitions Hodža's Essay (for secondary school students, main organiser: Milan Hodža Bilingual Grammar School in Sučany) and Hodža's Newspaper Article (for primary school pupils, main organiser: Milan Hodža Primary School in Bratislava), aimed at the formation of a democratic political culture. Pupils from Slovak schools abroad (Romania, Serbia, Ukraine) also participate in these competitions. The best essays have been published in collections. The Milan Hodža Days are implemented in cooperation with the Office of the Government of the Slovak Republic, the Ministry of Culture, the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic and the Žilina Self-Governing Region. As a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, several events within the project were cancelled, the evaluation of the Hodža essay and Hodža newspaper article competitions was carried out electronically. IPS SAS is also involved in the annual awarding of the Milan Hodža Award for the promotion of Slovakia and the work of Milan Hodža abroad, as well as for the support of pedagogical

and awareness-raising activities. It is awarded to prominent historians and publicists dealing with the history of Slovak politics in the first half of the 20th century.

Following the successful implementation of the Milan Hodža Days cycle, since 2016 the Institute has been implementing, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic, the Office of the Government of the Slovak Republic and the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic, a lecture series for the general public "Leading Figures of Slovak Politics", focusing on important personalities of Slovak politics of the 20th century at the University Library in Bratislava, which is one of the most important libraries in Slovakia (e.g. Ivan Dérer, Pavel Blaho, Ivan Markovič, Samuel Zoch, etc.). Also in connection with the growth of support for right-wing extremism after 2018, this project is called "Leading Figures of Slovak Politics and Extremism", which highlights the effort to draw attention to positive stories of political behaviour in the past. Since 2018, seminars have also started to be organised specifically for history and civics teachers through the Methodological and Pedagogical Centre in each municipality, thus increasing its outreach to the general public and the youngest generations. Institutions such as the Slovak National Uprising Museum in Banská Bystrica, the State Pedagogical Institute, the Slovak National Museum - Museum of Jewish Culture and the M. R. Štefánik Foundation also cooperated in the project. The topics of the seminars were also related to one of the harshest forms of extremism - the Holocaust. After 2019, representatives of the Ministry of the Interior of the Slovak Republic with a focus on extremist symbolism and the Faculty of Law of Comenius University in Bratislava (anti-extremist legislation), as well as the Slovak Union of Anti-Fascist Fighters, also became partners of the project. Since 2017, the Institute has also participated in the activities of the Commission for Combating Fascism of the Committee on European Affairs of the National Council of the Slovak Republic.

Since 2007, Institute has been presenting the exhibition "Slovak National Councils and the Road to Parliamentarism" in the entrance hall of the National Council of the Slovak Republic in the English-Slovak language version. The Milan Hodža Days were followed by a series of events marking the 100th anniversary of Czechoslovakia held in 2018 - the scientific conference "The Republic of Czecho-Slovakia. From Monarchy to Independent State. Illusions versus Reality" in Bratislava, held under the auspices of the President of the National Council of the Slovak Republic Andrej Danko (co-organisers: the State Archives in Bratislava, the SNP Museum, the Department of Political Science at the University of Applied Sciences in Košice, the M. R. Štefánik Foundation) and the conference "Slovakia at the Birth of Czechoslovakia" in Martin (co-organisers: the Office of the Government of the Slovak Republic, the Žilina Self-Governing Region, the City of Martin). Since 2018, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic, the scientific project "Slovakia's Path to an Independent State (1989-1993)" has been implemented, which included a scientific conference and the publication of a collective edited publication. IPS SAS participated in the organization of a scientific-popularization seminar on the 140th anniversary of the birth of Milan Hodža on 1 February 2018.

These projects were followed by the realisation of travelling exhibitions devoted to the formation of democratic Czech-Slovak statehood "Years of Struggles, Sacrifices and Hopes (1914 - 1920)" focused on the development of the Czech-Slovak legions in the states of the Triple Entente and the personality of M. R. Štefánik, "Milan Hodža - statesman and politician, publicist, scientist" and "General Milan Rastislav Štefánik (21 July, 1880 - 4 May, 1919)". These activities were coordinated by the former director of the Institute, Dr. Miroslav Pekník.

The staff of the Institute participated in the preparation of questions for the History Competition for students of grammar schools from the Czech Republic and Slovakia. A member of the Institute is a member of the Joint Selection Committee of the National Scholarship Programme of the Slovak Republic for the selection of foreign and Slovak scholarship holders (SAIA). The institute member, in charge of an expert from the practice, in the accreditation process of higher education institutions in the Slovak Republic, organized by the Slovak Accreditation Agency for Higher Education (SAAVŠ). Starting in 2021, another employee of the Institute acted as an external member of the Council for Implementation of the Internal Quality Assurance System for Higher Education at the Faculty of Arts of Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica. He was also an external member of the Council for Internal Quality Assessment of Higher Education at the University of Trnava in Trnava. In both cases these are permanent academic bodies of public universities. A specific form of pedagogical activity was the cooperation of the Institute's staff with the NGO Institute for Sustainable Democracy on the Create & Govern project (2021), which was an educational and training project based on the principle of political competition. Institute employee J. Marušiak acted as a mentor for

a group of high school students whose goal was to create a simulated political party and succeed in simulated parliamentary elections.

Books produced by the Institute have been requested by several scientific and cultural institutions in Slovakia and abroad, such as the Catholic University in Ružomberok, the Faculty of Education of the Comenius University (Bratislava), *Matica slovenská*, the Centre for Christian Education Martin, the College of International and Public Relations Prague, etc.

Studia Politica Slovaca, Journal for political science, contemporary history and international relations is a scientific peer-reviewed journal for political theory, political systems, political thought, recent political history and international relations. Compared to the previous evaluation period, we have made efforts to increase its visibility at the international level, both through the creation of an international editorial board and through the inclusion of journals in other international databases - in addition to CEEOL and ERIH PLUS, the journal was included in the CEJSH, DOAJ, INDEX COPERNICUS and NSD (Nordic List) databases.

We are currently working to meet the relevant criteria to gain indexing in the WOS and SCOPUS databases. The journal has received the DOI identifier that is assigned to the texts published in the

Studies and Analyses and Personal Profiles and Biographies (<http://www.sps.sav.sk/>). Efforts to internationalize the periodical continue, both through the creation of an international editorial board and by strengthening the representation of English-language texts and attracting authors from abroad, which we are also striving to do through the publication of thematic issues. The journal is Open Access; in 2020, we launched its online version. We have also introduced a double-blind peer review process. Measures to improve the quality of the journal are aimed at fulfilling the strategic goal of gaining indexation in the WOS and SCOPUS databases.

Among other institutions, the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic, the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic, the Slovak National Museum - Museum of Jewish Culture, Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra and Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice all had a hand in these activities.

In 2019, as part of the 15th Annual Milan Hodža Days, we organized a scholarly conference with the participation of the Department of Political Science Faculty of Arts, Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice and The Department of Political Science and Eurasian Studies of the Faculty of Arts, Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra, among other institutions.

This cooperation resulted in the publication of a thematic issue of the *Studia Politica Slovaca* Journal dedicated to Miroslav Kusý and his contribution to the development of political science in Slovakia.

Of the non-governmental research institutions, the most important for the institute was cooperation with the Research Centre of the Slovak Foreign Policy Association, which resulted in the participation of an IPS researcher in preparing the Slovak Foreign Policy Yearbook as an author and reviewer, as well as participation in preparing the background material for designing the Medium-Term Strategy of the Foreign Policy of the Slovak Republic for the needs of the Slovak Republic's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and European Affairs (2021). Following this cooperation, the IPS SAS, through its staff member, also participated in preparing the background material for outlining the priorities of Slovakia's Presidency in the V4 Group and Austerlitz Trilateral (Austerlitz-Format S3).

Compared to the past, the Institute has strengthened its presence in the European research area. This was helped by the acquisition of the SASPRO project, whose investigator Dr. Dirk Dalberg from Germany became a member of the Institute's staff following its completion. Another member of the Institute's staff is involved in the project Horizon 2020 (Grant Agreement 822419) Yet another member of the Institute's staff has joined the "Network of Experts" of the Horizon 2020 project, No. 692919, "COURAGE: Cultural opposition - Understanding cultural heritage of dissent in the former socialist countries", undertaken between 1 February 2016 and 31 January 2019 under the Horizon 2020 scheme. He was also involved in the project entitled "Czechoslovakism", coordinated by the Institute of Contemporary History, Czech Academy of Sciences. Over the last years we have been members of several international consortia that applied for European projects but were not finally approved for funding (Proposal Title Tracing Far Right Movements for Co-Constructing European Democratic Values, Proposal Reference OC-2019-1-23913). In 2019, we were also members of a consortium that applied for an international project under the HERA scheme (Humanities in the European Research Area, application no. Hera.1.199), but despite the positive evaluation of the project, we failed to receive the grant. In the latter half of 2021, two members of the Institute's staff participated in the preparation of a project under the HORIZON-CL2-2022-DEMOCRACY-01-02 (Civic Participation for Sturdy Democracy -STURDY) scheme, which, however, was not submitted until 2022. The Institute is a member of European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR). Since 2021, as a result of the solid link/relationship with the Slovak Political Science Association, it has been working closely with the Central European Political Science Association (CEPSA), e.g. through participation in the publication on the implications of COVID-19 for the teaching of political science in Central Europe, authored by representatives of political science associations from Central European countries. The preparation of the publication was intended as a first step towards forming a consortium to apply for an international project.

We have also participated in other international projects, mainly focused on Central European issues (see section 2.3.1). Although senior colleagues, who retired during the evaluation period, played an important role in involving the Institute in international projects, the renewal of the research team and the arrival of new colleagues from the younger and middle generation contributed to the visibility of the Institute in the international context. We are developing bilateral project cooperation with the Centre for Global Studies at the Philosophical Institute of the Czech Academy of Sciences in Prague and the Institute of Ethnography, Serbian Academy of Sciences and Arts, resulting in joint conferences or publications.

Compared to the past, the Institute's staff has strengthened its publication activities abroad. The recognition of their expertise is evidenced by the fact that they have been invited to co-author a number of international book projects in renowned Western publishing houses such as Palgrave Macmillan, Lexington/Rowman & Littlefield, L'Harmattan - Budapest, Peter Lang, Lidové Noviny Publishing House, Filosofia (Prague), Merlin Press (London) while a new publication, to be released by renowned foreign publishing houses (such as Ibidem Verlag, Palgrave, or Springer), work on which began in the evaluation period, will be published in 2022 or 2023 The Institute of Political

Science of the Slovak Academy of Sciences has made a significant contribution to the publication of *Seeking the National Interest. Slovakia 15 Years after EU and NATO Accession*. Brhlíková, R. (ed.). Stuttgart: ibidem Verlag (2020). The institute staff have been invited to international conferences such as. European Network Remembrance and Solidarity (Bucharest 2019), workshops (e.g. University of Leipzig, 2021 online), some of which have so far resulted in informal collaborations and invitations to further conferences and, in the case of the Leibniz Institute for the History and Culture of Eastern Europe (GWZO) (German: *Leibniz-Institut für Geschichte und Kultur des östlichen Europa*) in Leipzig/Germany, doctoral thesis consultancy. In view of the criticisms faced by the institute, we have decided to strengthen our English-language publishing, which has also had an impact on the growth of the number of our citations.

The project "Recovering Forgotten History" (2016, 2017, 2019) was implemented in cooperation with major international publishers of scholarly literature. Within the framework of the project, invited experts from the countries of Central and Eastern Europe provide ongoing refereeing of works by authors from renowned universities (mainly in the U.S., Canada and the U.K.), which deal with issues of recent history and contemporary politics in the region of Central and Eastern Europe. A fellow researcher of the Institute provided consultations (reviews) of the manuscripts of the following publications (Waters, L. *Borders on the Move. Territorial Change and Ethnic Cleansing in the Hungarian-Slovak Borderlands, 1938-1948*. <https://boydellandbrewer.com/9781648250019/borders-on-the-move/>; *Remaking Ukraine after World War II: The Clash of Local and Central Soviet Power* (New Studies in European History). <https://www.cambridge.org/core/books/remaking-ukraine-after-world-war-ii/27AD38DD94B35D3C47D4010A8CA1A3BB>; Moscow 1956. *The Silenced Spring* <https://www.hup.harvard.edu/catalog.php?isbn=9780674972001&content=bios>) etc. In recognition of the expertise of the Institute's staff, one of its members was also involved in the process of evaluating the projects of applicants for individual fellowships for the Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study (Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences).

On the basis of our expertise and partly in cooperation with the Slovak Embassy in Moscow, cooperation with the Institute of Europe of the Russian Academy of Sciences was initiated. In the period under review, an informal network of experts focused on the systematic analysis of the relations between Russia and Central Europe began to take shape with the participation of renowned institutions from abroad (e.g. the Institute of International Relations in Prague), with a focus on holding workshops, conferences and the publication of the journal *Visegrad Europe* in Russian and English. The Russian Federation's aggression against Ukraine has made the future of this cooperation questionable and recently we do not see any space for its continuation.

The internationalization of our research is also reflected in the publication Poláčková, Z. et al. *Minority Policies in Central and Eastern Europe in Comparative Perspective*. Bratislava: VEDA 2017 in English, with the participation of authors from Slovakia, United Kingdom (St. Andrews University), Hungary, Ukraine and Belarus.

Researchers actively participated in various international scientific events. At the same time, they were asked for various forms of consultations by colleagues from abroad. The fact that the Institute is reflected at least in the European research area is evidenced by the annual interest of scholars from other countries in their support of various scholarship programmes awarded by academic institutions in the Slovak Republic.

In the years 2016 - 2021, we continued to supervise PhD students. The Political and Democratic Theories of the Czech and Slovak Dissent in the 1970s and 1980s

In the years 2016 to 2021 our colleague Dirk Dalberg investigated the political thinking of Czechoslovak dissidents. He started to work on this subject during his SASPRO project (2016 to 2018). From 2019 on he continued to work on it at our institute.

His research on the topic had a direct social impact. He presented the project at various scientific conferences and in the context of scientific lectures in Slovakia, Austria, Germany, the Czech Republic and the UK. At the Comenius University in Bratislava, he gave lectures on the topic in the summer semester 2017 and summer semester 2018. He published the results of his work in the UK, Germany, Slovakia and the Czech Republic. Last but not least, he presented the results of his research as a habilitation thesis at the TU Chemnitz in Germany in 2021. This thesis was accepted in spring 2022. The book version of the work will be published in 2023 at the latest.

In addition to this more scientific impact, his research also had a direct influence on Slovak society. He spoke extensively about his research in the Slovak media (daily newspapers, TV, radio).

International relations with the main focus on the foreign policy of the Slovak Republic

Research on the international position of the Slovak Republic after 1989 has been the subject of research of IPS SAS since 1990s. In the period 2016-2021, research focused primarily on Slovakia's bilateral relations with neighbouring states and the Russian Federation, but also on the formation of nationality politics in Central Europe with regard to integration tendencies. However, the attention of the Institute's staff is also focused on the domestic political aspects of the formation of Slovakia's foreign policy, which are approached from constructivist aspects. The fact that international relations are one of the Institute's long-term priorities results in the existence of dynamic cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Slovak Republic as well as with the media. Institute member Juraj Marušiak has been running the course Comparative Politics III - Central Europe with a focus on Visegrad Group countries at the Faculty of Social and Economic Sciences, Comenius University in Bratislava since 2009. Part of his social impact is also his cooperation with the Research Centre of the Slovak Foreign Policy Association, where he participates as an author and as a member of the editorial board in the preparation of the Slovak Foreign Policy Yearbook. He actively participates in roundtables of experts and staff of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of SR on bilateral relations with the Czech Republic (2017) and the Russian Federation (2018, 2019). The Institute provided the reviewing process for the publication PURGAT, Juraj. *Výmena obyvateľstva medzi ČSR a Maďarskom v rokoch 1946-1949* [Population Exchange between Czechoslovakia and Hungary 1946-1949]. Slovak Community in Serbia and Slovakia – current political, socio-economic and cultural processes

The topic is the subject of bilateral cooperation between IPS SAS and the Institute of Ethnography, Serbian Academy of Sciences and Arts. It focuses on the consequences of uneven development in Slovakia and Serbia since the beginning of post-communist transition in 1989. Dominant trends include the growth of economically motivated migration from Serbia to Slovakia, which affects not only members of the local Slovak minority, but also other citizens of Serbia. In addition to changes in the identification processes of members of the local Slovak community, the consequences of migration processes on the receiving country, as well as on the society and local communities in the migrants' country of origin, are also the subject of research. The research is set in the context of the Europeanization of Slovak migration policy and centre-periphery relations, where Serbia is becoming part of the EU periphery after the accession of Slovakia and other post-communist states to the EU.

Dirk Mathias Dalberg studied political sciences and Eastern European history at Leipzig University/Germany and the Charles University in Prague/Czech Republic. In 2011, he defended his political science dissertation at the TU Dresden/Germany. From 2007 to 2008, he was a lecturer at the Zittau-Görlitz University of Applied Sciences (Germany) and subsequently at the University of Applied Police Science, Rothenburg/OL (Germany) until 2012, where he taught political science. In the years from 2012 to 2015 he held a post-doc position at the University of Pardubice (Strengthening of Research and Development Teams at the University of Pardubice/ESF ČR, Reg.n.: CZ 1.07/1.3.00/30.0021). There he taught history of political ideas and researched on Czech and Slovak political thought in the 19th and 20th century. In 2015 he also taught at Police Department Chemnitz (Germany). He was then a SASPRO fellow at the IPS SAS from 2016-2018. His research topic were the political ideas and theories in the Czech and Slovak dissident movement in the 1970s and 1980s. After the grant expired, he remained at the Institute. In 2021, he submitted his habilitation treatise which is connected with his research he made during his SASPRO scholarship, to the Faculty of Philosophy at TU Chemnitz, where it was accepted in 2022.

The societal impact of the Institute is based on the thematic focus of its research and the structure of its publications. Three categories of public impact can be identified:

- 1) cooperation with state and public authorities;
- 2) pedagogical impact;
- 3) cooperation with the media and NGOs.

Cooperation with public authorities has been long-standing, since the mid-1990s. It is related to the organisation of the annual Milan Hodža Days (conducted in Bratislava, Martin and Sučany), within which IPS SAS is responsible for the coordination of the professional part of the project. For the Office of the Government of the Slovak Republic, the event has significance not only as a commemoration of an important Slovak/Czechoslovak statesman of the first half of the 20th century, but also as a purposeful activity aimed at shaping democratic political culture in Slovakia through the commemoration of the democratic and anti-fascist traditions, as well as in terms of shaping the Central-European identity of Slovakia. The importance of this role was amplified after the 2016 parliamentary elections, when the far-right (neo-Nazi) People's Party Our Slovakia, claiming the legacy of the 1939-1945 Slovak state regime, became part of the parliament. The support for this party among young voters has triggered the need for more intensive work with primary and secondary school teachers to enable them to provide the young generation with positive models of political behaviour from the past. A series of discussions with the wider public (seminars at the University Library in Bratislava) was supplemented by seminars for teachers in the capitals of self-governing regions in Slovakia.

Other events that influenced cooperation with public authorities were the Slovak Presidency of the Council of the EU in 2016, the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the First Czechoslovak Republic (2018), and events related to the ongoing military conflict in Ukraine and the crisis of Central European cooperation. In this case, the Institute's staff, but also the Institute as such, made itself visible to the public not only through media appearances and other popularization activities, but also by providing expertise at the request of state authorities. The Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Slovak Republic was one of the recipients of the expertise. The invitation to provide

expertise in the preparation of the Medium-term Strategy of the Foreign Policy of the Slovak Republic and the priorities of the Slovak Presidency of the Visegrad Group and Austerlitz Triangle in 2021 can be considered as a certain culmination of such cooperation. Other addressees of the expert activity were the National Council of the Slovak Republic and the Police Corps of the Slovak Republic.

Pedagogical activities enable the transfer of knowledge gained through research to the wider public, namely university students, but also directly to primary and secondary school pupils through teacher training and the co-organisation of competitions (Hodža's Essay and Hodža's Newspaper Article).

A third important means of social impact of the Institute is through collaboration with the media and NGOs. It is important not only in terms of reflection on current events, where the Institute's staff is contacted by journalists from Slovak and foreign media, but also in commemorating important anniversaries that have had a major impact on the shaping of Slovak politics (the 100th anniversary of the founding of Czechoslovakia, the events of 1968, the commemoration of the events in WWII. etc.). The interest of the lay and professional public is also related to events abroad, with the Institute's staff being sought out in connection with events in the Czech Republic, Poland, Ukraine, Russia, France, Austria, Germany, etc. The Institute's staff also comment on political events in the media through their own articles. Cooperation with non-governmental organisations (e.g. Friedrich Ebert Foundation) enables the Institute's staff to participate in shaping the political debate in Slovakia.

Despite significant staff restructuring and efforts to recruit new staff using available project schemes, the problem of understaffing and the resulting low administrative capacity persists, making it difficult for the Institute to engage in larger international project schemes.

3. Implementation of the recommendations from the previous evaluation period

The evaluation report for the years 2012 - 2015 addressed a number of recommendations to the institute. The most relevant ones concerned the thematic scope. The four areas we presented in 2016 were gradually reduced to three - political theory, comparative politics and international relations. However, these areas are not examined in isolation; on the contrary, they often overlap in the institute's projects and publications. The topics have been studied in the current and historical perspectives. Yet, they are dominated by political science approaches while research focused exclusively on political history is gradually receding into the background, which is also a result of the change in the organisation's personnel structure, as several employees gradually left the institute after 2016. Research is now significantly shifting to discursive approaches, focusing on the current process of constructing political identities amid the fragmentation of traditional "grand" ideological and nationalist narratives and efforts to revive the idea of the nation state and identity approaches at the nation state level but also at the transnational level, which e.g. Rogers Brubaker describes as "civilisationism."

The project topics addressed at the institute have also undergone changes as a result of new societal challenges. These include the issue of migration not only in response to the refugee crisis in 2015 but also due to the fact that Slovakia is gradually becoming a destination country for international migration; other relevant issues to be touched on by the research are the problem of international terrorism, the growing impact of the far right and anti-system forces, the spread of conspiracy theories and hoaxes in the wake of a chain of crises and setbacks in current European developments, energy security but also the Covid-19 pandemic, the EU's Green Deal or differentiated integration, by which the EU responds to the diverse approaches to deepening European integration by Member States. One of the young researchers deals with the current trends in the development of democracy and the advent of the so-called post-democracy, the research being a continuation of his doctoral dissertation. Research into normative political theories fills the gap in the field of political science research in Slovakia, and it is mainly due to the SASPRO project that examination of the political thinking of Slovak and Czech dissidents is placed in the broader context of the history of European political thought.

The institute's status in the domestic arena has also improved as confirmed by the institute's involvement in five APVV projects in the period under review, with the main researchers being

relevant institutions from Slovakia (Department of Political Science, faculty of Arts, Comenius University in Bratislava; Institute of Sociology SAS; Faculty of Arts, Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica, Faculty of Political Science and International Relations, Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica) and with other scholarly institutions from Slovakia participating in the research teams. We are proud to have been granted our own APVV project in 2022; our success is a result of the efforts of the Institute's staff over the 2016 – 2021 period. We have competed for international projects with a number of scholarly institutions abroad, however, we have mostly not been successful. Our bilateral Slovak-Serbian inter-academic project resulted in joint publications in peer-reviewed journals. One of the Institute's researcher has joined the "Network of Experts" project Horizon 2020, No. 692919, "COURAGE: Cultural opposition - Understanding cultural heritage of dissent in the former socialist countries" (2016 - 2019). At the invitation of foreign partners, the Institute's staff participated in the preparation of a number of collective monographs with renowned foreign publishers such as Oxford University Press, Rowman and Littlefield, Palgrave, ibidem Verlag, Peter Lang et al. and increased the number of their publications in journals indexed in the WOS and SCOPUS databases (for more information on the activities in international networks see 2.4). Research aimed at the reevaluation of Marx's historical legacy and historical materialism continued, which the International Evaluation Panel for 2012-15 welcomed as a step forward.

The Institute's personnel structure has been optimised. Some of its members, mostly focused on historical research, left the institute. The age structure of the staff has also changed. The new fellow researchers, to a large extent (but not exclusively) from the ranks of former doctoral students of the department, have influenced the thematic focus of the projects undertaken by the Institute while other former doctoral students have carved out solid professional careers. Jaroslav Mihálik (now Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences of St. Cyril and Methodius University in Trnava) was a successful doctoral student supervised by J. Marušiak at the Faculty of Social and Economic Sciences of Comenius University; another of his doctoral students from the same faculty now works at the Ministry of Education and also as a part-time teacher at the Department of Political Science of the Faculty of Arts of the Trnava University. Three of the Institute's researchers are under the age of 35. In 2018, long-term director PhDr. Miroslav Pekník, CSc. was replaced by a middle-generation researcher PhDr. Peter Dinuš, PhD., to be succeeded by Mgr. Juraj Marušiak, PhD., also a member of the middle generation, in 2022.

Another trend is internationalisation of the research. In 2021, two members of the Institute's staff were nationals of other EU member countries (Czech Republic and Germany). At present, the institute employs one foreign researcher, who was also involved in the SASPRO project in 2016-2018. Based on the recommendation of the Evaluation panel, the share of staff not involved in the research activities has decreased significantly; most of them are only employed part-time. The institute has actively sought to recruit doctoral students, who could, depending on the Institute's funding, join the institute's staff upon completing their doctoral studies. We believe that the recommendations of the Evaluation Panel for the years 2012-2015 helped the institute to redefine its research objectives and its future direction.

4. Research strategy and future development of the institute for the next five years (Recommended 3 pages, max. 5 pages)

Research strategy of the institute in the national and international contexts, objectives, and methods (including the information on when the strategy was adopted)

The research activities of our Institute will be developed in the following three research areas:

1. Political theory and history of political thought
2. Comparative political science / Political Systems
3. International relationships (and foreign affairs of the Slovak Republic)

In doing so, we will build on the previous research that has already been carried out at the Institute in the above three areas. The clear goal is to raise the international visibility of the Institute's scholarly production and to further increase the number of publications indexed in the WOS and SCOPUS databases, including publications in the higher quartiles. This can be achieved through the

application of the internal constitutional rules for the evaluation of R&D staff, approved in the first half of 2022.

Research strategy

Area 1:

Extension of the research interest to the analysis of political discourse in East-Central-Europe in general and Slovakia in particular after 1989. What ideas were and are discussed? How do they fit into the broader context of contemporary European and American political thought? In this context, research on the transfer of political ideas from West to East and East to West in the field of the history of political thought is also important.

Extension/expansion of research on (traditional) political thought beyond the East-Central European context to Western Europe. To this end, we will host a British post-doc, who will conduct research on Friedrich Nietzsche and Machiavelli at IPS SAS within the framework of the National fellowship program of the Slovak Republic (September 2022 – June 2023). From this we expect to expand our research profile in this core research area.

In the field of political thought, we will also continue to focus on the shaping of domestic political discourse on foreign policy issues, especially in the context of current challenges such as the debate on the future of the EU and the current aggression of the Russian Federation against Ukraine. Further research will concentrate on the influence of the so-called conspiracy theories on the formation of political discourse in Slovakia.

We also foresee the continuation of research into Marxist reflection on the processes of post-communist transformation, and we will strive not only to continue our cooperation with the Centre for Global Studies of the Institute of Philosophy of the CAS, but also to attract other foreign partners.

Planned publications: A volume on the political thinking of Czech and Slovak dissidents in the 1970s and 1980s is planned for 2023. The publishing contract with the German publishing house *Ibidem* has already been signed. The book will be part of the prestigious SPPS-edition (Soviet and Post-Soviet Politics and Society).

With regard to the current debate on the transformations of political discourse in the context of changed relations between the West and the East, what is noteworthy is the participation of a fellow researcher from the Institute of Political Science SAS in the preparation of a collective publication dedicated to the current societal shifts and partial resurrection of the ideas of Pan-Slavism, which will be published by the Palgrave Publishing House.

Area 2: In order to improve our position in the field of research on the Slovak political system and to make it internationally visible, in cooperation with the Leipzig University (Prof. Dr. Astrid Lorenz), a publication of a volume on the political system of the Slovak Republic is planned for 2023. The publishing contract with the German publishing house *Springer Nature* has already been signed.

A monograph on the 1946 parliamentary elections is in preparation; it focuses on the nature of the political system of the so-called Third Czechoslovak Republic (1945-1948) and the ideological legitimisation of its regime. The research will also be centred on the development of the party system in Slovakia.

In 2022, we applied for the VEGA grant “Forms and mechanisms of differentiation and reconfiguration of public and political life. Collective actions and political attitudes”, registration number 2/0068/23 for the period of years 2023 – 2026. IPS SAS is the principal investigator (Dr. Norbert Kmeť), the partner organizations are: Institute of Sociology, SAS and Department of Political Science and Eurasian Studies, Constantine Philosopher University in Nitra.

Area 3: Over the next five years, research in the field of international relations will primarily concentrate on the development of European integration, where the Institute is involved in two APVV

projects - EU Green Recovery in the Post-Covid Period (APVV-20-0012; duration: 2021-2024). The main objective of the research is to examine challenges connected to green post-pandemic recovery from several perspectives (European, regional, national) and in a number of areas (political, social, and economic impacts of the pandemic in energy sector including coal phase out, the role of nuclear power and renewables). The APVV grant – Slovakia in European Differentiated Governance Regime (SKEUDIFGOVRE, APVV-21-0237, duration: 2022 - 2026) aims to analyse the nature of the processes of state's adaptation to the changing EU's political order, namely, to answer the question, what consequences does the participation in the EU's DI governance regime have for Slovakia? The issues of international relations, especially amid the conflict between the West and Russia, are also part of the research in the project "This is not true, but it could be. Conspiracy theories and hoaxes in the modern development of Slovakia in the European context" (APVV-20-0334, duration: 2021 – 2025). Research on Slovakia's bilateral relations with its neighbours and most important partners, especially in the region of Central and Eastern Europe, will be continued.

International cooperation

The Covid-19 pandemic has led to the slackening of the pace of the Institute's international activities as a result of the difficulty in travelling and carrying out mobility activities. Nevertheless, we participated in the preparation of the STURDY project (HORIZON-CL2-2022-DEMOCRACY-01-02; Civic Participation for Sturdy Democracy -STURDY) and applied for a project under the Visegrad Strategic Grant scheme focused on the dialogue of collective memories within the V4 group and its impact on the foreign policies of V4 states. Although we were unsuccessful in the latter case, we plan to reapply for a project on the impact of historical memory on the foreign policy of the V4 countries.

The cooperation with The Leibniz Institute for the History and Culture of Eastern Europe (GWZO) in Leipzig/Germany will be continued and even enhanced. In addition, we will start cooperation with the Faculty of Philosophy of the TU Chemnitz (Institute of Political Science)/Germany, where one of our staff members is completing his habilitation. After the successful defence of his thesis, he will be awarded a title of Privatdozent (Priv-Doz.) at the same university. Further opportunities for new activities in international cooperation are created by the Institute's involvement in international projects and in teams working on international publications. Among prospective international activities we can also include cooperation with the European Network for Remembrance and Solidarity and we consider cooperation with the Institute of Ethnography, Serbian Academy of Sciences and Arts as a good basis for wider international cooperation. Here, we foresee placing existing projects in a broader international comparative framework.

Personal and institutional development of the Institute

The transformation of the Slovak Academy of Sciences institutes into public research institutions in 2022 has raised the question of greater autonomy and greater responsibility of the directors for the future existence of the SAS organisations. This particularly pertains to the question of the institutes' sustainability, especially of those with a small number of employees. It will be critically important for the Institute to strive to further improve the staff's age structure and to increase their numbers, which in the current circumstances is only possible by applying for research projects that also allow the creation of new jobs, i.e. projects supported by the APVV and EU funds (Horizon Europe, COST, etc.). We also plan to use other schemes that allow inviting visiting researchers and also to involve more actively foreign researchers visiting the Institute in the Institute's research activities or in international cooperation through mobility programmes such as the National Scholarship Programme or the Visegrad Scholarship Programme. Other possibilities are offered by the involvement of scientists who had to leave Ukraine as a result of war events and whose stay is financed by a specialised programme of the Government of the Slovak Republic.

Another source of recruitment is the use of existing programmes (such as the Stefan Schwarz Support Fund) to create positions for postdoctoral fellows, which requires more active involvement of PhD students in the Institute's research projects and publication activities. In the interest of securing the future of doctoral studies, one of the Institute's strategic goals is to have one or two staff

members as close as possible to meeting the criteria for the degree of “Doctor of Science” (DrSc.) or “Professor” (Prof.) in the next few years. We will also strive to recruit PhD students from abroad and to send current PhD students for internships abroad and to involve them in international programmes such as Cotutelle and Co-direction.

From the institutional point of view, we foresee the integration of the Institute of Political Science SAS into a larger entity while maintaining its partial subjectivity in the form of an organisational unit or department, which will increase the flexibility of the Institute’ staff in engaging in domestic and international projects and will also reduce the administrative burden on the management of the Institute.
